**Official Candidacy Applications for** 

**Directors Election Must Be Submitted** 

Elections will be held for Directors representing Zones 3, 4 and 8. The first two digits of your Aqua Water Supply account number is your zone number. The Official Candidacy Application and petition forms are available at Aqua's administrative office and may also be obtained from Aqua's web site. From the Homepage, select the "About Us" link; from the links listed on the right, select "Board of Directors" and you will see a link for the Official Candidacy Application and petition forms. Upon request, forms will be mailed to any Aqua member receiving service or residing in Zones 3, 4 or 8. Effective September 1,

Between December 1-31, 2017 2011, the law governing elections held by nonprofit water supply corporations does not allow (1) proxies

to be cast; (2) nominations for directors from the floor; or (3) write-in votes.

In 2013 the law was further modified, and the Aqua Board of Directors approved new procedures to comply, as follows: A person who desires their name be placed on the Official Ballot as a candidate for a Director position must complete and file with Aqua an Official Candidacy Application, including a petition executed by

20 members located within the candidate's zone, biographical information, and a photograph, between the first and thirty-first day of December, 2017.

To be eligible to serve as Director, you must be a member of Aqua, receive water within the Aqua Zone you represent, be 18 years of age or older and have not been determined, by a final judgment of a court exercising probate jurisdiction, to be (a) totally mentally incapacitated; or (b) partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote; and have not been finally convicted of a felony from which you have not been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disabilities.

# **Typical Household Water Usage**

Are you aware how much water your household uses? The good news is that Aqua members are ahead of schedule in meeting longterm conservation planning goals that were set in 2014.

Those goals set a target of 91 gallons per person per day by 2019, and a target of 89 gallons by 2024. Currently, the average residential water usage for Aqua's membership is 71 gallons per person per day.

\* The "Other" category includes evaporative cooling, humidification, water softening, and other uncategorized indoor uses.

Following are some statistics about typical water usage for each routine household activity, along with suggestions on how to save water... which also saves money!

Activity	Typical Usage	Conservation Suggestions
Flushing Toilet	2-3 gallons per flush	Install a new low-flow toilet. Use displacement devices (bottles or bags, not bricks) to reduce water per flush. Be sure to check for leaks.
Showering	5 to 10 gallons per minute	Take shorter showers. Install water saving showerheads, which are typically designed to use just 2-3 gallons per minute.
Bathing in Tub	Full tub: 36 gallons	Fill tub one-third of the way full and use 10-12 gallons, or take a shower instead.
Sink Faucets	2 to 3 gallons per minute	Install low-volume faucet aerators to reduce the flow. Always turn off water while brushing teeth, washing hands, and shaving.
Hand Washing Dishes	20 gallons or more (tap running)	Scrape food off before washing dishes. If you have two basins, use one for washing and the other for rinsing.
Dishwasher	6 to 16 gallons per load	Run only full loads. EnergyStar models use 6 gallons or less per wash cycle.
Clothes Washer	25 gallons per load (new models) 40 to 45 gallons per load (older models)	Run full loads only. EnergyStar clothes washers not only save water, but also save electricity.
Outdoor Hand Watering	Garden hose 2-3 gallons per minute	Limit watering, avoid runoff, and don't water between 8:00 am and 7:00 pm.
