Time to Apply for Aqua Scholarship Program

Applications are now being accepted for the annual Ernest W. Bracewell, Sr. Memorial Scholarship Program. The Aqua scholarship application and guidelines can be obtained through Aqua's website, www.aquawsc.com, or from the business office at 415 Old Austin Highway in Bastrop.

The application deadline is June 1, 2018, and scholarships will be awarded by August.

Cooperative members of Aqua and immediate family members are eligible to apply for a scholarship, provided they meet the following qualifications:

- Applicant must be a

member of Aqua WSC or an immediate family member in the same household as the Aqua member

- Aqua member account must be current
- Applicant must maintain
  a grade point average of
  2.5 or higher
- Applicant must be enrolled as a full-time student by an accredited business/ trade or college institution; funding for a Masters or Post Graduate Degree will be considered.
- Applicant must be a U.S. citizen.

Aqua adopted a scholarship program in 2007 to provide extra help to customers with family members seeking higher education. Each selected applicant receives a scholar-ship in the amount of \$3,000; receiving half in the first semester upon proof of enrollment in an accredited course of study, and half in the second semester, provided the minimum GPA requirements are met.

Completed application forms must be submitted by June 1, along with proof of GPA, two letters of recommendation, proof of citizenship (copy of birth certificate or passport) and a personal essay for review by the Aqua scholarship committee.



# **How Do You Define Quality?**

More than 50,000 people rely on Aqua Water Supply for safe, reliable drinking water. The health and well-being of our cooperative members is our top priority, and we follow professional processes to test and treat our water supply for optimum safety, ensuring that Aqua meets all federal and state standards.

In addition to safety considerations, we also make every effort to achieve high quality standards. In others words, delivery of water that does not have an unpleasant color, taste or odor. The perceived quality of the water delivered to your home can be affected by a number of factors, such as weather related events, drops in pressure within the distribution system, internal plumbing issues in your home, and the natural state of our source water, which is obtained exclusively from groundwater sources.

cern may be related to particles in the water. Here is a guide to what might cause this particular issue.
-- Black particles that are solid, yet rubbery in texture, could be pieces of a disintegrating faucet washer or gasket. This problem would likely only occur in one faucet and can be fixed by replacing the washers.

One potential water quality con-

-- If the particles are very small in size, black in color, and oily or sooty in texture, they may come from the inside of a flexible hose, such as

hoses located under the sink, or connecting the water heater to the water supply. While these hoses may be covered with a braided stainless steel mesh on the outside, they are made of black rubber on the inside. Over time, chlorine in the water can cause the rubber to break down.

-- Particles that are small, irregular in size and shape, very hard and variable in color might be iron deposits. They are not a health hazard, but these particles can be a nuisance if they clog shower heads or the aerator screens at the ends of your faucets. If your water is clear but contains these particles, they likely came from the inside of your pipes.

-- White or tan particles that are flake-like, very thin and irregular in shape may be a combination of calcium carbonate and magnesium carbonate, naturally occurring minerals found in most water around the world. Often referred to as scale deposits, these particles are a typical indicator of hard water, but they are not a health threat. Over time, these minerals can deposit on the inside of your pipes and then begin to flake off gradually. If your water has been turned off for repair work, pressure and turbulence created when it is turned back on can dislodge the



minerals from the pipes. Likewise, if you install a water softener in your home, the softer water can dissolve the minerals, and pieces may begin to break loose from inside the pipes. -- Round and sand-like particles that are white or tan may result from minerals accumulated in your water heater. As the water is heated, the minerals begin to form sand-like deposits, which are then carried through the plumbing and may clog the inlet screens in washing machines, shower heads and faucet aerators. To keep mineral deposits from accumulating, it's recommended that you flush the water heater at least once a year. Flushing the water heater regularly also helps it operate more cost-efficiently.


