Bottled Water or Tap? Just the Facts

Last year, Americans consumed nearly 54 million liters of bottled water. We buy flavored water, water with electrolytes, so-called "purified" water and even rainwater in a bottle. Have you ever stopped to consider how much time and money is spent on bottled water, or even how much plastic waste is produced? And is it really healthier for us, or just marketing hype?

In the vast majority of cases, bottled water and tap water are equally safe, healthy choices. Tap water in the U.S. is regulated by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) under the Safe Drinking Water Act, enacted to ensure the quality of public drinking water systems. This law requires that water suppliers regularly test their water supply, conducting thousands of analyses each year to verify that the public water supply meets

federal water quality standards.

When your water supplier meets these strict standards for tap water — as we do at Aqua Water Supply — you can have a high degree of confidence in the safety of water from the tap. In fact, some of the largest distributors of bottled water use municipal water as their source, with more than half of all bottled water coming from the tap.

While the EPA is in charge of regulating tap water, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) regulates bottled water, since bottled water is considered

a packaged food product. However, the FDA requires bottled water quality standards to be equal to those standards set for tap water. So, it's not surprising that many experts say that tap water in the U.S. is typically just as good as bottled water.

At the end of the day, there are a variety of reasons why people may choose to buy bottled water. But the belief that bottled water is generally healthier is actually a misconception. And considering that bottled water can cost more than \$9 per gallon, compared to fractions of a penny for a gallon of tap water, our national love affair with bottled water is a rather pricey infatuation.

A Guide to Smart Watering

Did you know that outdoor residential water use in the U.S. accounts for more than 9 billion gallons of water each day? In fact, the average household uses more water outdoors than for showering and washing clothes combined. A large part of that water is used for landscape irrigation.


Yet, it's estimated that as much as 50 percent of this water is wasted due to overwatering, caused by inefficient irrigation methods and systems. 
