Boosting Broadband Access in Bastrop County

In today's alwaysconnected world, internet access is vital — for businesses, families, students and for quality of life. And now as we find ourselves living in a strange, sociallydistanced society, internet connectivity is even more important than ever.

High-speed internet access over broadband networks allows use of online services at significantly faster speeds than traditional telephone connections. These networks can use various technologies, including cable modem, wireless broadband or fiber optics. But for many homes and businesses in rural areas, broadband speeds simply are not available yet.

In an effort to enhance and expand broadband access, adoption and use throughout Bastrop County, the Bastrop County Cares organization has teamed up with Connected Nation Texas and their "Connected Community" program. These groups are working together to assess the state of broadband availability in Bastrop County, and establish a planning process to address current and future broadband needs for the benefit of local residents and businesses.

Where to Start

The first step on the journey to increasing internet access is to gain a better understanding of Bastrop County's current broadband environment. To that end, the Bastrop County Broadband Committee is conducting surveys of residents across the county. Results from this work will be shared with the public, followed by

additional work to develop a countywide action plan to address identified areas of need.

To Conserve and Protect

If you've lived in Texas for any length of time, this may not come as a surprise... At the beginning of August of this year, about 33 percent of the state was in drought. Although drought conditions have been relatively milder in Central Texas so far this year, remembering to conserve the water that we have is still critical.

Like other communities and water

suppliers across Texas, we are thinking ahead about our water supplies. Experts have estimated that the state's population will increase more than 70 percent by the year 2070, which means increasing demands on water.

Aqua is committed to addressing water supply challenges and protecting our water supplies for future generations. We continue to ask Aqua mem-

bers to follow regular water conservation practices, such as limiting outdoor watering, using water-efficient fixtures and appliances, fixing water leaks, and planting drought-tolerant landscapes.




